CHED turns 20

On Thursday, May 15, the regional office celebrated the 20th Founding Anniversary of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) that kicked off with a motorcade around Tacloban City.

In the program that followed, the Commission paid tribute to the top performing schools which produced top ten placers in 2013 and first placers for the past 20 years in the different licensure examinations, (see list of awardees on page 2)

The regional office also gave recognition to two of its employees who have served the Commission for the past 20 years, namely, Ms. Evelyn C. Competente and Ms. Wilma C.

De Luna. Both have started their careers at the Higher Education Division of the then Department of Education, Culture, and Sports (DECS).

To mark this milestone. SUCs admit ESGP-PA grantees

In coordination with its partner agencies in carrying-out the Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) 2014-1, "Guidelines on the Implementation of Expanded Students' Grants-In-Program Aid for Poverty Alleviation", CHEDRO8 conducted a meeting with the Scholarship Coordinators and the Accountants of the State and Universities (SUCs) in the region on May 20 at the Function Hall of the Holy Infant College, Tacloban City.

The body got updates from the different SUCs and member agencies on the status of ESGP-PA implementation for AY 2014-2015. SUC representatives reported that they already started the admission process for their potential grantees as early as April. It was noted in their reports that only very few of the DSWD identified potential grantees took the exam or underwent the school's screening process; thus, there are still a significant number of available slots. Recommendation was made in

allowing the SUC current students who belong to 4Ps families to avail of the ESGP-PA these slots subject to DSWD's validation. Ten SUCs were represented during the meeting, namely; EVSU, LNU, VSU, NSU, PIT, SLSU, SSU, ESSU, NwSSU and UEP.

DBM-RO8 official, Ms. Arlene Tizon, informed the body that budget allocation for ESGP-PA is already included in budget for the year; however, it can only be downloaded to the SUCs after the Master List of Students Enrolled in ESGP-PA Program is submitted. The same list should be confirmed by the TWG of the ESGP-PA through a resolution.

The partner agencies in this project are the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Department of Budget and Management (DBM), Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), and Commission on Higher Education (CHED).
