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LNU, ESSU grads are top examinees

LET 2015

Jefferson Egana Flores and Sung Shin Woong III Abad Cipriano, both alumni of the Leyte Normal University, ranked 3rd and 10th, respectively, among the successful examinees who garnered the ten highest places in the March 2015 Licensure Examination for Teachers (LET) - Secondary Level. Mr. Flores obtained a rating of 90%, while

Mr. Cipriano got a rating of 88.60%

Moreover, with a rating of 88.40%, Ms. Geraldine Valenzuela Colico, a graduate of the Eastern Samar State University in Borongan City, placed 10th in the LET—Elementary Level. She is now currently employed at her Alma Mater as a faculty member.

A total of 17,904 out of 66,896 examinees passed the LET—Secondary Level or a national passing percentage of 31.63. Meanwhile, 12,103 out of 44,144 examinees successfully hurdled the LET—

The Commission *En Banc* acts as a collegial body in formulating plans, policies and strategies relating to higher education and the operation of CHED.

VSU grad tops 2015 Forester Licensure Exam

Ms. Marjorie Diaz Elbifa, a graduate of Visayas State University (VSU) tops this year's Forester Licensure Examination.

Elbifa, who is a consistent achiever from Ormoc City, graduated in 2015 as *cum laude* from the Visayas State University, Baybay, Leyte and a finalist in the undergraduate thesis category for the Phi Delta search for best thesis award.

With a rating of 90.95%, Elbifa outdid 460 other examinees. The other successful examinees who garnered the top 10 places were: Rece Ruby Gera Tering (90.10%), Caraga State University; Herbert Caagbay Molinyawe (89.70%), University of the Philippines - Los Banos; Eddie Ventula Lupio Jr. (89.65%), University of Southeastern Philippines; Jonathan Rafael Seradilla Redimano (89.56%), UPLB; Menzuela Hidalgo Ancheta (89.50%), Nueva Vizcaya State University; Alexandra Jewel

Libunao Rosas (89.00%), UPLB; Armstrong Faustino Hedoquio (88.75%), Mindanao State University; Lawrence Adolph Manguac Amada (88.40%), UPLB; and Jason Anabieza Parlucha (88.20%), Central Mindanao University.

Overall, the Visayas State University has 60% passing percentage (35 examinees: 21 passers) while the University of Eastern Philippines has passing percentage of 37.50% (8 examinees: 3 passers).

The Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) released the board result two days after the exam which was given by the Board of Foresters in the cities of Manila, Cagayan De Oro and Davao. There were 961 examinees from universities and colleges offering BS Forestry in the country.

Coverage: Educational Tours/and or Field Trips in the Philippines duly required in the approved curriculum

Salient Points:

- HEIs shall implement the appropriate educational tours and/or field trips in accordance with the specific degree program requirement.
- Security of the students should be the foremost responsibility of the higher education institutions concerned.
- HEI authorities shall inform parents or guardians on the HEI guidelines on the conduct of educational tours and/or field trips.
- HEI guidelines for educational tours and/or field trips or on-the-job training shall be written in their Student Handbook.
- Prior consultation including the manner, time and duration of the educational tour and/or field trips shall be done by the concerned HEIs with the concerned students and stakeholders.
- HEI shall inform the CHEDRO on the details of the educational tour and/or field trip one month before the opening of classes for every academic year.
